Submissions

The National Conference Planning Committee hereby calls for submission of high quality papers on the Conference sub-themes for presentation during the Conference. The papers are expected to be original, conceptual, constructive, empirical, practical, experimental or theoretical in presentation.

Final paper presentations shall be on A4 paper double line spacing, New Times Roman font of 12 points and not exceeding 15 pages, including references. The following are further required:

- Papers must be appropriately referenced;
- Illustrations (features, maps, diagrams) in colours must be clear and distinct;
- Presenters are also required to prepare PowerPoint submissions not exceeding 15 slides, including the cover and appreciation slides; and
- All would-be presenters are expected to register to participate in the Conference.

All submitted Conference papers in soft copy, will be subjected to blind peer review by competent reviewers. The Conference Planning Committee reserves the right to step down submissions that do not conform to the stipulated requirements without

explanations to the contributors. All submissions would be duly acknowledged.

Abstract of papers are to be submitted by authors to the email addresses stated below on or before **Friday, 15th March, 2019**.
